Registration Information

Please register as soon as possible beginning February 1, 2011 either online (preferred) or through the US mail. Please consider using our online registration system at www.NCRS.org/events. Complete instructions online and earlier in this *Driveline*. Please take advantage of it!

Registration forms postmarked prior to February 1, 2012 or incomplete will not be processed and will be returned to the sender. Registration forms received in the Cincinnati office after May 15, 2012, will not be processed and will be returned to the sender. After May 15, 2012, you may only register on-site at the convention. You will not be able to register a Corvette for any event, and you will be subject to an additional \$40 late registration fee.

Your pre-registration makes it possible for NCRS to effectively plan and produce a great convention at a very reasonable cost. Your early registration will minimize the chances that your car will be waitlisted, or that you will not be able to attend a particular event. We anticipate significant interest in many events as always. Please do not wait until the last minute to register. The later you register, the greater the chance that you will be disappointed!

Convention registrations will be confirmed by return mail (mailed approximately every two weeks starting in March). Registration packets, meal tickets, shirts and name badges, etc. must be picked up at the NCRS Registration Desk. Please always wear your Convention name badge. It is required for admission to all NCRS Convention events.

Cancellation Information

NCRS Convention and/or Judging Registration cancellations must be received in writing (US Mail, fax or email- whatever is easiest for you) on or before Tuesday, May 15, 2012, and will be subject to a \$25 service charge.

There will be no refunds for cancellations received after May 16, 2012. On that date, we confirm all the tours, meals, etc. with our various vendors. If you cannot attend after that late date, the NCRS is still responsible for paying our vendors for anything you ordered: therefore, no refunds.

Entries accepted, in order, by US Postal Service postmark date OR a successfully completed and paid online registration at www.NCRS.org/events/. First Class mail only (no overnight express!). Entries postmarked prior to February 1st, 2012, or those which are incomplete in any way will be returned. **NO JUDGING ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER MAY 15th. YOUR COMPLETED REGISTRATION MATERIALS MUST ARRIVE IN CINCINNATI ON OR BEFORE MAY 15th TO BE CONSIDERED FOR JUDGING AT THE CONVENTION.**

All Flight®/Duntov/McLellan/Hill Divisions are limited to eight (8) cars; PV® Divisions to four (4) cars; Star/Bowtie and Crossed Flags Divisions to four (4) cars; Founders® unlimited; American Heritage by invitation only. **ALL DIVISIONS CLOSE ON May 15th.** All cars to be judged must be in place and checked-in at the Judging Registration desk between 9am and 5pm Monday, July 18th. Any entry not in place will be considered a scratch, the deposit forfeited, and cars on the waiting list will be eligible. Judged cars must remain in place until the completion of all judging on Friday afternoon.

Flight Judging® Requirements: With your application and payment, you must include proof that your car has achieved an NCRS Third Flight® Award (or higher), under your ownership, since January 1, 2009. Proof of vehicle ownership and proof of liability insurance must also be supplied with your registration. If any of these required items are not available when you submit your registration, please so indicate, however, all of the missing items must be received in the Cincinnati office no later than May 15. The owner is the only person who may enter *and* represent a car for judging. You will be required to remain with your car on Sunday, July 1st, after all Operations Judging is completed, so that you may drive your car for placement in its predetermined spot in the Grand Exhibit Hall.

Duntov (1953-74), McLellan (1975-92) and Hill (1993-1996) Judging Requirements: With your application and payment, you must include proof that your car has achieved at least a 97.0 Net Score at an NCRS Regional Meet or National Convention and proof that your car has achieved an NCRS Performance Verification® Award, both under your ownership and since January 1, 2009. Liability insurance, ownership, representation, and remaining with your car until it has been placed in the Grand Exhibit Hall on Sunday, July 1st are all the same as noted above under Flight Judging® Requirements.

Performance Verification® Requirements: Identical to Flight Judging®. In addition, the car must be licensed for legal street operation and the owner/operator must have a valid drivers license. Liability insurance and proof of vehicle ownership are identical to Flight Judging® above. The car must be moved to the outside parking lot early enough to cool for the "cold start".

Star/Bowtie Judging Requirements: Available at this Convention for 1953-1982 Corvettes. A completely filled out Star/Bowtie application (available in the *NCRS Judging Reference Manual*) must be included with your entry. Vehicle ownership proof and insurance requirements are identical to those shown in Flight Judging® above. Refer to the *NCRS Judging Reference Manual* for prerequisites.

Crossed Flags Judging Requirements: Available at this Convention for 1984-1996 Corvettes that have received the McLellan Award. Vehicle ownership proof and insurance requirements are identical to those shown in Flight Judging® above. Refer to the *NCRS Judging Reference Manual* for prerequisites.

Founders Judging® Requirements: Refer to the current (Eighth Edition) *NCRS Judging Reference Manual* for specific requirements. Proof of ownership and liability insurance are identical to the Flight Judging® requirements shown above.

American Heritagesm Judging Requirements: Proof of ownership and liability insurance are identical to Flight Judging® above. Refer to the *NCRS Judging Reference Manual* for prerequisites.

Year of the 1962 Requirements: This display class is open to any and all 1962 Corvettes- restored, unrestored, customized, rolling chassis, or even partially completed. Cars will be displayed in a special area. Owners will also receive a special plaque.

Contingency Applications: Those applying for Flight®, Duntov, McLellan, Hill, PV®, Heritage or Founders® Judging who have not yet completed the requirements, but intend to do so prior to June 1st may apply on a contingency basis. With your application, include specific information indicating where and when you will be attempting to fulfill your requirements. Priority will be given according to completion date of your requirements.

Judging Confirmation and On-Site Deposit Refunds: All Judging Confirmations will be sent to you only by the National Judging Chairman, separate from Convention Registration confirmation. Judging deposit refunds will be made at the Convention upon confirmation that the owner and the registered car are in place for judging.

Judges: Team Judges will be selected and contacted from among the most experienced available by the Division Team Leaders. Every effort will be made to have the Judging Teams contacted and confirmed by early June.

Observer Judges: Members with little or no experience are strongly encouraged to join in by registering as an Observer Judge. You will not be contacted prior to the Convention and need only to be present as indicated on the schedule.

Members Applying to Enter More than One Car: Use a separate application for each car entered. Your multiple application will be governed by those rules outlined in the *NCRS Judging Reference Manual*.

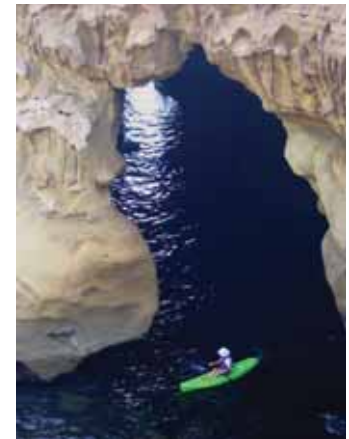

Judging Seminar

Advanced NCRS Judging Seminar with Terry McManmon

Terry McManmon, one of the NCRS' highest level Judges, long time National Judging Team Leader, *Corvette Restorer* Magazine Editor, National Corvette Museum Hall of Fame Member, etc. will again lead his dual session Judging seminar. Terry and a team of Master Judges select a highly original Corvette and then use it as the example of many original parts and assemblies. Lifts allow up close viewing.

Technical Sessions

Tuning the Corvette Engine for Maximum Performance and Economy- Presented by Duke Williams

Time/Date: 10:00AM to 11:30AM Sunday, July 1

Duke Williams is a retired automotive and aerospace engineer and holds a Master's Degree in Mechanical Engineering from the University of Wisconsin Engine Research Center. Duke will begin by discussing the combustion process and the effect of variables such as throttling, A/F ratio, and exhaust gas dilution on combustion speed and the resulting spark advance requirements. In the process, some cherished myths may be exploded. If you've ever replaced ignition points or carburetor jets, you can do the job on your car for your specific ambient and driving conditions. The result should be a noticeable improvement in power and throttle response, particularly in the low to mid rev range where 99-plus percent of our driving time is spent. With four-dollar per gallon gasoline, most will appreciate the improvement in fuel economy. *No NCRS Judging Points will be awarded.*

C1, C2, and C3 Corvette Convertible Top Installation Technique- Presented by Jeff Reade

Jeff Reade, NCRS member for over 30 years, has presented many seminars for California NCRS Chapters and at Bloomington on the many different areas of restoring Corvettes back to their original looks and operation.
