

The New Year's Day Garage Tour was started many years ago by one of our chapter's founding members, Carlos Vivas. His idea of having a car centered alternative to typical New Year's Day festivities was very popular, and has only grown in popularity. Participants literally come from out of state to participate. This year we once again, we pay tribute to Carlos, with another wonderful tour in his honor.

We brought in 2024 with a total of six locations that required only five stops. One stop had two locations.

Despite an unusually wet California winter, the weather gave us all a much-needed break from the rain. Well over 200 people showed up for this year's tour. The starting point, as has always been the case, was the location of the Pismo Derelicts car gathering. These are held every Saturday, and it has served us for the New Year's Day Tour every year since inception.







People started showing up in all manner of cars, trucks, motorcycles, Corvettes (of course) well before the 9:00am appointed hour for handing out the directions for the first stop.

One person that deserves special recognition in helping make this year's tour just a little classier is Sean Beauchamp of Southpaw Signs. He offered to create a large Garage Tour banner, and foam core signs for display at each stop. He did this all on his own

Without further ado, here's a rundown of the Garage Tour Stops for New Year's Day 2024.

When asked if he'd be willing to open his garage and car collection, without hesitation Mr. Bob Kruse said yes. His purpose-built garage is spacious, and houses many of his varied car collection. Bob's plan was to have a garage with enough room to park every car and open every door without hitting anything. To his credit, he has managed to avoid packing in more cars than this plan would allow. We all know that is not so easy a thing to do. Bob had his collection inside and outside the garage to allow the sea of people the room necessary to walk around and admire.





Southpaw Sign Co was **stop two** on the tour. Sean Beauchamp is the owner. 

- **1. Welcome / Introductions:** Board Members present indicated by X on the meeting minutes. In addition, attending members included: Ed & Barbara Vignone, Jim Collins, Larry Guevara, Mike and Sharyl Ingham.
- **2. Approval of 8/3/2023 Zoom Board meeting minutes:** Steve Shrefler motions to approve the minutes. Craig Landen 2nd approval. Minutes approved.
- **3. Chairman's Report:** Chairman Chris Bowser is stepping down from his Board position for 2024 due to his plumbing business responsibilities. Jim Collins has agreed to run for this position for 2024. Chris Bowser could not attend meeting. Vice-Chairman Ron Bartow conducted the meeting in Chris Bowser's absence.
- **4. Judging Chairman Report:** <u>Judging Chairman</u> Steve Shrefler and <u>Judging Administrator</u> Bruce Fosdike. I purchased a "Repair Kit Shifter Major" for my 1967 Corvette that's currently going through a body off restoration. As with any bodyoff restoration project, there are countless subsections that require their own restoration, replacement, or at least attention. After all,

we're talking about items that may have been completely neglected for more than half a century. This was certainly the case with my car.

The procedure here will cover the 1964 to 1967 models, but there are just minor differences with the 1968 and up, so this information may help those "newer" the working on Corvettes as well.

Removing the shifter is slightly different depending on the year your Corvette was built. some period near the middle of production for the 1966 model,



the shifter position was changed from being mounted directly to the side of the transmission, to being mounted to the chassis. I remember as a young teen reading in magazines focused on Corvettes (Remember magazines?) that the drag racers would always complain about the chassis mounted shifter position. The torque twist during high powered

quarter mile runs would play havoc on the linkage since the shifter wasn't twisting with the engine


This article will just cover the rebuilding of the shifter assembly, and a couple techniques for setting up the shift linkage afterward. Removing the shifter assembly is not covered here, although the first three things we would do in our rebuild will aid us I removing the shifter assembly from the car if the body is still in place.





Step One is to unscrew the shifter knob (#1). **Step Two** is to remove the inner lockout rod *spring*. This spring resembles the spring inside a pen (#2). **Step Three** is to remove the T-handle. This just lifts out along *with* the reverse lockout rod (#4 & #7). At this point we head under the car to remove the shifter. With the shift ball and T-handle removed, the shifter will be able to drop down through the boot without catching on anything.


When you finally get the shifter assembly in your hand, it's time to start with our disassembly. It's important to note the condition of the parts as we disassemble. The major repair kit I purchased from one of our NCRS advertisers, *Corvette Pacifica*, had all the parts that I needed to replace in my particular rebuild, but there are other parts that could be worn, rusted, or damaged that are available at prices that won't break the bank.

It should be noted at this point that there are two bolts that hold the shifter assembly to the bracket. (Either the chassis bracket or transmission bracket) One bolt goes through the middle of the hollow shaft that is shown as #9 in the exploded view diagram. The other bolt is lower and forward.










Step Five, you can now remove the pin #9 in the diagram from the bracket.

Step Six will almost take care of itself. With the pin out of the bracket (#18) all the levers are now free (14, 16, & 17) as well as the interlock (15).






t this point, as note to help you in putting the levers and interlock together, a brief description on how this thing works. The levers and interlock are the mirror image of what we think of when sitting in our seat above, shifting through the gears.

We know up in the driver's seat, reverse is to the left. Then first and second, and a slide over to the right

for third and fourth. Conversely, the far-right down here lever (passenger side) is reverse. The interlock, (no movement at all) is the what keeps us from being able to shift into reverse without pulling up on our T-handle. That thin metal pole that came out with the T-handle has to be lifted up over the interlock to allow us to move the reverse lever (#14). When you look at these levers, you see that the farthest left lever (#17) is your 3-4 shift, the middle lever (#16) is your 1-2 shift, then the lockout (#15) protecting reverse, and farthest right is reverse (#14). Also, to aid in the reassembly, take a close look at the levers themselves. As the diagram illustrates, the have a general hook shape toward the front. The 3-4 lever has the longest reach left. The 1-2 lever has a short reach left. The interlock (which we will change out from one of the two new interlocks provided in the kit) is flat. The only lever that reaches to the right is reverse.



Step Seven, wearing eye protection, remove the retainer or G-clip (#11).



Step Eight, pull out the pin (#10) that holds the shifter handle within the bracket. The shift handle has a cone shaped spring washer on the front side that is held in place by the pin we just removed. This spring washer will be reused.

Step Nine is to remove the handle out through the bottom without losing the spring washer.

Step Ten and Eleven involve cleaning, and inspecting all the parts we reuse. Years of solidified grease, dirt, and surface rust will need to be removed.



Step Twelve involves determining which of the two new interlocks you will use in your rebuild. One is thicker than factory (7/64"), the other is standard factory thickness (5/64"). With the three levers lubricated with white grease, place the three levers in the bracket (#18) and choose whichever lockout allows you to move the levers without binding, and without excessive side-to-side slop movement.

Step Thirteen you may have already done, but just in case you haven't, grease the inside of the bracket (#13) that houses the shift levers and interlock, and install them in the proper sequence. As discussed earlier, 14, new 15 (either regular or thicker), 16, and 17 all greased and set inside bracket (#13). If you want, a zip tie or a short piece of dowel rod can hold it loosely together before the final assembly.

Steps 10&11
Clean & Inspect

Step Fourteen requires us to grease the flat area on the front and rear of the shift handle, along with the bracket (#18). Also grease the new shaft (#9) from the kit that will be the pivot to all our shift levers. In addition, grease the pin (#10) that will lock in our shifter handle. In **Step Fifteen** we slip the shifter shaft up from the bottom side of the bracket (#18) <u>WITH</u> the spring washer in place on the front of the shifter shaft. Don't forget that little cone spring washer. **Step Sixteen**, install the new little pin (#10) in from the back, through the shifter shaft and spring washer. Then install the G-clip in front. (Eye protection please! These little guys can fly across a room.)

And now for the tricky part. Don't fear. It *will* go back together. For **Step Seventeen** we have to install the bracket (#13) that holds our three shifter levers and our one new interlock, into the bracket (#18) that holds the shifter. Since all these pieces are loose at this point, it will take some patience. When bringing these two brackets together, we have to make sure the shifter tail is on the *left* side of the interlock (#15). The tail of the shifter should be where the 3-4, 1-2 levers are located.

Now for **Step Eighteen**, using what little patience remains, you'll need to install the new and greased pivot shaft (#9) through both of the brackets and all of the shifter arms and the interlock. I found that using a combination of the new shaft (#9) and the old one is helpful. I fed the new shaft from the right side and the old shaft I fed from the incorrect left side. This will get a few of the items in the correct line. With a couple on each side held in the proper position, you can wiggle around the remaining pieces and get them lined up. If you can get the two shafts to touch, just push the new shaft through. Once that is complete, all you need to do is install the retaining clip (#12) on the end of the shaft without losing an eye. (Hint, eye protection)

At this point, you have rebuilt your shifter. The installation back into the car should be the next step.




After the shifter has been installed in your car, you can put some grease on the T-handle lockout rod and slip that onto the shifter arm, add the small spring the resembles a pen spring and screw on the shift knob. Congratulate yourself. A big step is done towards great shifting.

However, there is still the allimportant task of adjusting the shift linkage so you glide though gears effortlessly. There is one tool you should consider purchasing that will help a great deal. In the assembly manual, it is referenced as simply "locating gage (8)" and the drawing shows

it is listed as, "Gauge – Shifter Adjust with instructions 1964-81." Five dollars will get you one of your own.

Throughout your shifter rebuilding process, you may

have noticed the rectangle notches in each of the shifter arms, as well as in the lockout, and the bracket (#13). When each of these notches is lined up, this is the correct position for



neutral on our shifter. The trick is to line up the rectangle slots and slip the alignment tool in there to hold the levers exactly where you need them. With these levers held steady, we connect the shifter side to the rod. With every lever on the *transmission* in neutral (the 3-4 and 1-2 and reverse lever), we can adjust the length of each rod to fit precisely. Follow the procedure in your assembly manual. Remember that optional equipment is always shown near the end of the manual. Be sure to look for wear on the transmission shift levers. If they can be wiggled around, they won't give you a clean shift. With this final step of linkage adjustment completed, you should have a smooth and positive shifting experience.

Current NCRS President Mark Tulley Comments on Mike Ingham candidacy announcement






2024 NCRS Convention






