Chapter Meeting Notes

November Technical Seminar

– On Saturday November 5th
our Chapter hosted a Technical
Seminar featuring Al Greening
speaking about Corvette

Documentation. Al is a well known historian on this subject and has compiled a substantial collection of factory build records, reproductions of Corvette Production Documents and photographs of engine serial number pads and body trim tags.

Our meeting was hosted by Garry Brown at the Highlights for Children corporate offices near downtown Columbus. Garry graciously offered us their conference room which was more than large enough to accommodate our group. It is a great facility. Lou and Randy provided donuts and coffee to get us started.

About 40 NCRS Members and guests attended. The one who came from furthest away was a gentleman from Utah who was in town on business; the person who drove the farthest for the day came from an NCRS Chapter in Maryland. Other chapters represented, in addition to HoO, were Cincinnati, Dayton, Lake Erie, Pittsburgh and Detroit. It was a great turnout.

Al's presentation was titled "Originality – How Typical Is It?". It was divided into two parts. The first part, before lunch, concentrated on

documents that were generated during the Corvette ordering, building and sales stages. His presentation in the afternoon was on Corvette engine stamps and engine stamp abnormalities. Both presentations were overwhelming in the amount of information presented and in Al's familiarity with his material.

"The Corvette Production Order" was the title of Al's morning presentation. There was a tremendous amount of paperwork produced when a Corvette was manufactured. There were at least nine separate documents required to build each car and many of them filed in quadruplicate and sent to multiple locations. While most of this paperwork has been destroyed, a surprising amount is still available for Corvette authentication purposes. These documents contain a tremendous amount of information about every car

Al talked about each document that was created in the production order process and passed around, or showed on his two screens, samples of many of them. He also explained how they flowed through General Motors production process.

One very interesting topic Al

discussed during this document presentation was GM's use of Exception Letters and how they could be deciphered. Designed as an inventory control measure these codes today are a powerful authentication tool.

Al's presentation after lunch was titled "Corvette Engine Pads". Once again he presented a tremendous amount of information. He began by showing us pictures of about 20 different engine pads and asked us to verify which we thought were the work of the UAW (i.e. official) and which were not (i.e. they were done by somebody else). He then told us to hold on to these "quiz" papers for later.

For the next hour Al explained the process of how engine stamp pads were created in the factory and showed us many examples of both normal and abnormal pads that were perfectly legitimate. He also mixed in a few examples whose authenticity was questionable. Once again the amount of information he presented was overwhelming. It was also very enlightening. Just as in many of the steps in the creation of the production documents, the stamping of engine stamp pad serial numbers was done by

humans and subject to human error.

At the end of this presentation Al once again gave us his quiz and asked us to reevaluate our earlier decision of an engine pads authenticity. He then told us the correct answers. It was most interesting.

I think of the all of the "take away" messages this seminar provided me, the most important one was about the buzz words "numbers matching" which seem to appear frequently in the descriptions of used Corvettes. I quote from Al's notes:

"In addition, there is a trap waiting to snatch the uninitiated into thinking somehow the words "numbers matching" relate to originality. THESE WORDS – "NUMBERS MATCHING" HAVE NO ORIGINALITY RELATIONSHIP TO ANY COMPONENT OF A CLASSIC CORVETTE. In fact, to the initiated these are the words of direct warning to be skeptical."

If anyone left this presentation thinking otherwise they were asleep. Al's presentation was excellent. He had a tremendous amount of pictures he showed us simultaneously on two screens as he spoke and he gladly stopped to answer questions. In addition, he provided us all with a 19-page handout summarizing much of the material he presented. It also including topics he did not have time to present such as Trim Tags. Copies of this document are available from Lou Zuniga.

We would like to thank Dave Borror and Jim Salvino for hosting Al while he was in Columbus, Randy Rink for the excellent job of catering breakfast, lunch and beverages, Lou Zuniga and Jim Salvino for organizing and overseeing the seminar and Priscilla Rink and Pam Matejovic for staffing the registration desk. And we especially would like to thank Garry Brown for providing us with a great venue.

Please bring a wrapped <u>Corvette</u> gift (one per couple or individual). A gift exchange will spread the Christmas Spirit.


