Chapter Meeting Notes

The Heart of Ohio's February Chapter Technical Seminar was

held on Saturday February 4th at Bob's Garage and was titled "Demystifying the Early Corvette Ignitions". It was presented by Lou Zuniga and Perry Yasher. Over a dozen chapter members attended.

The seminar consisted of both presentations by Perry and Lou followed by a hands-on demonstration on Randy Mullins big block Chevelle Super Sport. The presentations were relatively informal and



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Perry made the first presentation that was a basic primer on how electricity flowed. He used the analogy of water flowing through a hose and tied each of the various measurements of electricity such as voltage and amperage to that analogy. This was a good review for me because it has been many years since I had Physics in High School and it prepared us for the morning's next session.

Lou next made a presentation on how an older car's ignition system works. He began by telling us that the basic design of the ignition systems on all cars, up until the early 1970's, dated back to 1910. That was the year that Charles Franklin Kettering, who went on to found Dayton Engineering Laboratories Company, DELCO Electric, patenting the ignition system and the self starting automobile. The fact that this ignition system design lasted so long, and is still in use today, demonstrates how efficient and reliable it is.

In his presentation Lou used diagrams from the web site "howstuffworks.com" to illustrate how each component in an ignition system worked and the role it played in creating a spark. He also talked about how each particular component could fail and how to troubleshoot it.

In the third part of the session we went out into Bob's Garage and Lou conducted a "live" ignition troubleshooting demonstration on Randy Mullin's car. Using a pair of test leads and an electrical multi-meter, Lou illustrated how to test each of the engine's ignition system's components. Again, this session was very informal and there was plenty of opportunity for questions and answers and group discussions.

This technical session will be followed on March 4th by a second session on Corvette electronics titled "The Corvette Electrical System". I hope to see you all there.

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Dallas Judging Retreat

This past February I was fortunate enough to attend the NCRS Judging Retreat School in Dallas TX. Last year, by my own doing, I missed the Retreat due to my procrastination. Later in the Spring I did, however, have the chance to attend a similar Judging School that was held by the Heart of Ohio Chapter with the assistance of Dave and Marilyn Heitzman, Paul Borowski, Jim Salvino and Steve Steffensen. If I have for gotten others I do apologize. For those that attended that seminar this seminar was very much the same format that I experience at the Dallas Retreat this past February.

This year I committed early to attending the Retreat, held again in Dallas, and I was well rewarded. It gave me, and several other members of our chapter, a host of knowledge that can only be gained by attending many judging shows across the country. Oh, and as a bonus, I was treated to the best Tex Mex food I have ever experienced.

The Retreat began with a full day of classroom instructions.

And, I mean a full day of classroom instruction. The first day began with a 7:00 AM to 8:00 AM continental breakfast with refreshments. The classroom sessions started promptly at 8:00 AM and consisted of seven hours of instruction. The first class was the topic of the NCRS Judges Reference Manual covering the basis for NCRS judging process. The next class was on Corvette Operations followed by a break. After the break the course dealt with Judging 101, the basic principals of judging and courtesy.

At lunch, we played it safe and ate in the hotel, a commendable meal for a Hilton hotel. The afternoon consisted of a two-hour class on the scoring matrix with a bit of history on the subject then a detailed instruction on the NCRS Judging standards and judging guidelines, based on Originality, Condition and cleanliness.

The final class of the day was a two-hour session judging Paint and Finish. The emphasis on instruction here I found to be a deviation from past judging standards. The instruction doctrine now stresses the appearance of the finish as it came off the assembly line and not necessarily the type of paint

used. The reasoning was that many states are now banning the use of Lacquer paint due to its toxic nature. However, the finish of the vehicle still needs to appear the same as the assembly process where paint was dull in the areas where the UAW worker would not buff the car's finish such as the door jams, inside hood surrounds and trunk areas.

The second day of the Judges Retreat consisted of actual judging in two-person consistent with normal judging procedures. Four teams were assigned per each vehicle in which two teams were on the car judging and two teams were scheduled to be in a group discussion with the judging instructors, referred as the Bull Pen discussions. Each team was schedule to judge four of the five judging reference manual sections. The one exception, of course, was the omittance of the Operations Section of the judging process.

Teams were assigned to be judging on the vehicle for 15 minutes and then sitting-out for 15 minutes in the bull pen discussion groups. Since each team had only 15 minutes per cycle the teams were given three intervals of judging and bull pen discussions. The emphasis was to concentrate on



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The purpose of the bull pen discussions was for each of the judging teams to review what they had discovered during their time on the vehicle and the amount of the deduction points they had given for these discrepancies based on the judging manual. In these sessions the Judging Instructors questioned the teams on their reasons for their deductions based on the Judging Guidelines' criteria on Configuration, Date, Completeness, Installation and Finish. Again the emphasis was on the use of the previous day's class instructions.

I came away with a new NCRS mantra of giving the owner credit for any part or finish in which the appearance was similar to factory finishing standards. That is to say, that if the owner installed a replacement part that looked similar to the original, then the replacement part should be given credit for being the

factory installed part. The reason for this is to side more with the owner in appreciation of the effort they have put into the vehicle's restoration and to recognize their intent in the restoration and submission to the NCRS judging process.

I see this new direction as a double edged sword. On the one edge the owners will appreciate that their efforts are rewarded and more individuals will continue the NCRS judging process. On the other edge this gives the unscrupulous restorers more leeway to deceive a future buyer/owner in creating a Top Flight NCRS judged Corvette for purely monetary purposes.

However, I still believe that there are more individuals that are trying to restore their Corvettes to the original state than those that take the deceitful route and to these individuals that remain honest I praise them for their values and efforts. Keep up the honest work!
