# 1967 L-71 Coupe Restoration Continuation Steve Bertling NCRS #65340

As most of you know, my brother Norbert left us in Novembeur 2018, before his beloved 1967 L71 project was completed. So, I have undertaken this project and will be completing it for him. It has taken me this long to get my shop ready and to get all the parts transported and logged.

Now that it is all in my garage, I have started working on the car itself. We had the motor in the frame and suspension done while Norbert was still with us. In fact, he was still helping in the restoration efforts the week before he passed. I only hope he keeps me on the right path to get this completed as he would want. The following are pictures of where we currently are at with the project.





The day we brought it to my garage with help from my friend C.J.Wilson and Tom Earlbeck, who let me use his trailer. Here it sits in its new home.





Removing the body again so I can finish replacing body mounts and prepping the underside.



The frame gets to hang out with my motorcycles for a while. I will be finishing the drive train, brake lines, exhaust and gas tank while the body is off.

### True Barnfind - 1970 Corvette Kim / Rob Barnes - NCRS #18969

The victim - a 1970 Corvette Convertible - Donnybrooke Green on green vinyl. The Corvette was located by a Ferrari collector friend in Vermont. The car had been sitting in a shed for the last ten years. The original owner had died and his family was agreeable to selling the Corvette. We purchased it site unseen in November 2018. Fortunately the owner saved the protecto plate, warrenty books and other original paperwork; and the car has all the original components including interior and paint.

The C3 arrived in Maryland surprisingly DOA and rodent infested in December 2018. Before attempting to start the engine, we rotated the assembly to make sure it was not locked up.

First, we took the dash out to the firewall ensuring that all wiring and vacuum lines were intact. We cleaned up electrical connections behind the dash and engine compartment, to include corroded connections with transistorized Ignition system. We reassembled the interior to include freeing up the power windows and door locks.

Second, we tried to start the engine after purging all the old fuel from the tank, lines, and carburetor. We then put five gallons of Aviation Fuel (low lead 100 octane in the tank). The engine now had spark, fuel and air; it started quickly but had no oil pressure. So, we put it on the lift and pulled the oil pan. We inspected the oil pan, windage tray and passage doors which were all congealed with one inch deep sludge (sludge was above the elevation of the oil pump pick up screen).

Third, was a careful clean up of the oil pan; inspect and photo document the exposed lower end of the engine (which looked good). We then reinstalled the oil pan with the existing oil pump still installed. We filled the crankcase with 10-30 GM oil and Lucas ZDDP additive. We removed the distributor and primed the oiling system with a Jegs oil pump primer tool.

Fourth, Kim started the car; ever the protector, I was outside with a fire extinguisher, just in case! The car started right away and ran beautifully with around 70 lbs of oil pressure. Initial problems resolved, and follow-on cleanup will follow in the next installment. Here are some pictures of the progress to get the car started!

# Celebrate! Celebrate! 2003 Corvette Turns 50

2003 was a special year for the Corvette. It had been in production for 50 years, a milestone by any measure. The success of the Corvette was a tribute to the fact that it never lost sight of it's original intentions: fast affordable fun with an abundance of style and pizzazz.

Corvette owners celebrated the 50th with parties, caravans, a road tour involving conventions, Nashville KY, the Corvette Museum and the Bowling Green manufacturing facility. In 2002, Corvette was the honored marque at the Monterey historic automobile races in August.



A 2003 Corvette paced the 2002 Indy 500. Although no pace car replicas were available, a Indy 500 decal package could be had for \$495.00.

A 50th Anniversary Edition Corvette (RPO 1SC; \$5,000) was available for 2003. It included an Anniversary Red exterior paint along with a Shale interior (below) and convertible top. RPO 1SC was not available with the Z06. All 2003 Corvettes, including the Z06, were treated to 50th Anniversary emblems on the nose and front fender.



Corvette engineers got a lot closer to active suspension nirvana with the introduction of the Magnetic Selective Ride Control (RPO F55; \$1,695.00) introduced in 2003. It was miles ahead of the previous Selective Real Time Damping (RPO F45; \$1,695.00) which also adjusted the suspension but was slow doing so. The Magnetic Selective Ride Control (MSRC) equipped Corvettes had an advanced shock absorber system which featured a fluid with tiny iron particles. An electronically controlled magnet changed the fluid in a way that caused it to flow through the orifices at a controlled rate. This had the effect of making the shock absorbers quickly adjustable for all driving conditions. The system had two modes: Active and Sport.

Ride quality was excellent with the MSRC, which is where the advantage of being able to quickly adjust the shocks really comes into its own. MSRC was not available with the Z06 which is probably a reflection of its pure performance intentions.


















#### Persistence
