1971 Alternator Repalcement Gus Tsamouras NCRS #47583

I purchased a very correct and original-looking 1971, and over the winter months I have been doing a lot of "cosmetic" cleaning to determine exactly how original she really is. One area I was unable to properly clean was the alternator. I was able to find a correct dated alternator during a lengthy internet search and the following is a description of removing the old alternator and replacing with the newly purchased one.

- 1. Using a fender apron whenever you have to do any work under the hood of your Corvette is always a good idea since it protects the fender from belt-buckle scratches and doubles as a mat for resting your tools on, too.
- 2. Disconnect the positive lead from the battery. You can get a nasty shock when removing your Corvette's alternator if you don't take this precaution first.
- 3. Use a nut driver or socket to remove the 5/16" nut that secures the black ground wire to the alternator, and pull the wire free of its stud.
- 4. The harness plug is removed next by depressing its clip and pulling it out. The rubber boot on the red positive lead can then be pulled back and the 7/16" retaining nut taken off so the lead can be removed from your Corvette's alternator. This completes the electrical disconnections.
- 5. A ¹/₂" bolt secures the top of the alternator to the upper mounting or adjusting bracket, and this bolt is the next item to be removed. The bracket can then be swung up and out of the way at this point.
- 6. Push the alternator toward the engine to gain some slack in the belt, then slip the belt over and off the pulley.
- 7. Pull the alternator toward the inner fender as far as it will go so you can gain easier access to the lower mounting pivot bolt. Use a 9/16" socket with an extension to remove the nut and lock washer from the bolt.
- 8. Once the nut is removed, the bolt can be removed from the lower mounting bracket. You may have to give it a gentle tap, but it should pull free without too much trouble. With this done, remove the old alternator from the vehicle.
- 9. Installing the new alternator is a reversal of the steps used to your Corvette's original alternator. Start by positioning the alternator in the lower mounting bracket, then insert the bolt and snug-up the nut with lock washer. Slip the belt over the pulley and insert the ½" bolt through the upper mounting bracket and thread it into the alternator. Use a prybar to put tension on the belt by pulling the alternator toward you while you tighten the upper mounting bolt. Tighten the nut on the lower mounting bolt, reconnect the positive lead, the harness plug and the ground lead, then reconnect the positive battery lead and start the car up.
- 10. Connect the positive and common leads of a multimeter to the corresponding terminals on the alternator, select the 20-volt range and see what kind of voltage the new alternator is putting out; it should be between 12.5 and 14-volts if its working correctly. When it checks out OK, shut the engine off, disconnect the multimeter and slip the rubber boot over the positive terminal on the alternator.

The following are pictures of the old alternator removed from the Corvette; and the new alternator now mounted in the Corvette. Job completed! WELL DONE!





Fixing a Fallen Rear Window 1999 Convertible James Buckley - NCRS #55336

A number of weeks ago I walked outside to find the back glass window of my 1999 convertible separated from the top.

I've did lots of research (including BMW, Audi and other convertible top postings). The results are that upholstery people usually say the sealing process is high pressure done under heat at the factory and there is no way to duplicate it in the field so you have to replace the top. Estimates for top replacement range from lows in the area of \$500 to \$1000 to a high of \$3000 with the average being \$1000 to \$1500.

Some people report glue attempts with total failures after days or weeks. Others report glue success and the glue holding after much longer times.

Those reporting glue success used a variety of glues including: JB Weld, Black silicone RTV sealant, pure clear silicone sealer, 3M high black weatherstrip adhesive, and urethane windshield glue. One person posted that he used a cyanoacrylate glue that he got at a hobby shop. Super glue and its various other names are cyanoacrylate glues.

I did my own research and settled on Rhino Glue which is a specially formulated cyanoacrylate that is waterproof, weatherproof and completely resistant to heat and cold. See <u>www.rhinoglue.com</u> for more information. These are the pictures I took before attempting to glue the glass back in to the convertible top.

I found that if I unlatched the top and lifted it about a foot that it relieved the stretched fabric enough to manually push it against the glass. I then applied the glue around the glass about 3 to 6 inches at a time. Be careful and test this out before you apply the glue. I made the mistake of starting on the sides and moving toward the middle and was left with a significant bunching at the middle. The glue set up so fast that I actually had to cut the top away from the glass at the corner to smooth out the bunching. At the finish of the job, I was still left with a little bunching at the drivers side. As I'm not a perfectionist and it isn't very noticeable, I haven't tried to correct it.

C6 Corvette Z06, Only More So



There was no Z06 available for 2005, but it was no secret to Corvette followers that one would be available in 2006. The demand was there; with 20% of Corvette sales devoted to the club racing favorite GM had no choice but to continue the tradition.

The year off was a good thing as when the Z06 became available, it was truly something special. The engine displacement was 427 cu. in. (7.0 liters), a magic number for Corvette fans that recalled fond big block memories not seen since 1969. The 2006 iteration was a different displacement on the Gen IV "small block" engine, not a separate engine family as with the C2 and C3 Corvettes.

The 2006 Z06 motor could honestly be described as a race car engine that was street legal. The specification sheet had a lot in common with what was found in the C5-R racing engine that won the GTS class at Le Mans and the 24 hours of Daytona overall. On the 2006 corvette Z06 specs list was titanium connecting rods, CNC ported heads with titanium intake valves and sodium filled exhaust valves, an 11.0:1 compression ratio and cast aluminum flat top pistons.

Possibly the most impressive feature of the Z06 motor is visible from the outside by comparing the Z06 motor to any other Corvette motor. There is no oil cap on the engine cover. That's because the Z06 has dry sump lubrication, an advanced and expensive addition that consists of a separate eight quart oil tank (above right, with the oil fill cap, and the oil level dip stick; complete system is to the right) and a pump to feed the engine oil. Not storing the oil in a sump at the bottom of the engine prevents oil starvation, which can occur in competition under sustained high speed cornering. Although common in race cars and high dollar exotics, dry sump lubrication is typically unheard of in cars costing less than \$100,000. The oil tank takes the place of the battery which was moved to the luggage compartment.

Want to have some fun with your motorhead friends? Show them a Corvette C6 Z06 engine bay and ask them to find the oil filler cap. They'll probably look all over the engine, not find it and then give up. You can then point them to the rear right corner where the oil sump tank and the oil filler are located. Inform them of the advantages of dry sump lubrication and they will then have a new appreciation for the Corvette as a serious performance vehicle.
