Replacing Coil Spring Spacers on a C3 Chris Krieger - NCRS 47844


C3 Coil Spring Spacers

I was chasing a body lean issue last summer on my 1973, the typical lower driver side lean often seen on C3s. I changed my rear spring four times and even tried a composite spring with little or no change! I tried longer rear spring bolts lowering the passenger side, but it required too much for a small change. BTW, I had previously replaced all four body mount cushions. After some research I realized that a small change in the FRONT would also affect the rear!

GM actually made spacers for our Corvettes and other models. Early big block C-60 C3's have been found with spring spacers under the front coil springs. Whether these were installed at the factory or as a service to compensate for air conditioning weight remains debatable. The spacer was installed on the bottom between the lower control arm and spring. It's virtually impossible to detect unless you're specifically looking for it. This spacer is different from the aftermarket ones that are placed between individual spring coils.

So how did I solve my lean? By installing a GM spacer on the left front which LOWERED the right rear! Now the car is perfectly horizontal and all four tire to body measurements are exactly in specifications.

I hope this article helps others solve those mysterious body lean conundrums!
