



Here's the story of my 59. In 1991, my father purchased the Corvette for about \$35k. I was 22 and a junior in college. It was a long-time dream of my father's to own a Corvette. Whenever my brother or I would visit my parents, they lived in New Jersey at the time, we would take it out for a drive.

One of our favorite places to go, was the Black Horse Pub. My parents would take my dad's car, and I would take the Vette. The car would be valet parked, and it always had pride of place. My parents and I would get a window seat, and watch the people who would check out the Vette. One evening, we were at the pub, and saw a man walking past the car, and he was looking at it. As he passed the car I told my parents, "It's okay, he'll turn around and have a closer look." Sure enough, the man turned around and had a closer look.

Eventually, my career, took me to Dallas, where my brother, and his family lived. In time, when my father was forced to retire, he and my mother moved here too. I'd like to think it was because I was here, but who am I kidding? My brother, and his wife, had a beautiful

I felt better.

Anyway, after a time, the Corvette was parked in my brother's garage, and there it sat. I'd say it was there for at least three years, and my sister-in-law,

Joan, hated it. Over the years, the tires went flat, and the gas gummed up the carburetor. I told my dad, "I have a garage, and would be more than happy to drive it from time to time. So around 2008, my dad gave me the Corvette.

I genuinely enjoy the Corvette. I take more pleasure out of the joy it brings other people, than I do, owning the car. Many years ago, when I lived in Dallas, I would go to Keller's Drive In, on a Saturday night. They would host an unofficial car show. One evening, as things were winding down, a car drove by, and stopped by my Corvette. A little girl, maybe about seven, got out and started taking pictures of the Corvette. I thought to myself, this is probably the closest that this girl will get to owning a classic car. I approached her, and asked if she'd like to sit in the car, and I would take her picture. She agreed, and I took a few pics of her in the drivers seat. To this day, that is my favorite memory. It brings a tear to my eye, thinking about it.

Over the years, we have put a lot of money into the car. I plan on gifting it, no time soon, to one of my nieces. We took it to Carr's Corvettes and Customs, and had him install front disc brakes, power steering, and unknown to me, it was repainted. It looks gorgeous, and according to Carr, is worth in the neighborhood of \$90k. My niece, who I plan on giving the Corvette to, doesn't know how to drive a manual transmission. Fortunately, my father has a 2004 Corvette ZO6, with a manual, so they will learn on that. Not ideal, but we don't know anyone with a car that has a manual transmission. Anyway, one of the improvements on the '59 is a 5-speed transmission, that is similar in feel to the ZO6.

So that's the story of my 1959 Corvette. A dream that my father was able to fulfill, and I'm happy to know that I'll be able to keep it in the family.

I'd like to leave you with this. My life-long dream was to be a professional pilot. After many years, and the unflagging support of my parents, I achieved that dream. Over time I became a captain for American Eagle Airlines, earning my type rating in the Saab 340 turbo-prop, and the Embraer 145 Regional Jet. Several years ago, I suffered the rupture of an AVM in my cerebellum.(Google it) Anyway, after having brain surgery, to remove the AVM, I lost my medical certificate, and was unable to fly. I was left with various disabilities, but I'm still able to drive. Driving the Corvette is just that much more special, and I would ask all of you, especially those who own a classic, take a bit more joy when you drive it. Remember that you are one of the few who still cherish the vehicle, and value it's impact on the history of, not just the American vehicle history, but of the history of vehicles, world wide. We own a part of history. A history that must be preserved.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER for 2019 SACC CONVENTION

Tadge Juechter has been chief engineer-Cadillac XLR & Chevrolet Corvette, at General Motors Co. since 2006. He has been with Corvette since 1993. His role as Total Vehicle Systems Engineer on the C5 program involved him in all aspects of the creation of the 97MY Corvette. He was also instrumental in putting the C5 Corvette Z06 on the street. In 1999, Juechter was promoted to assistant chief engineer throughout the C6 development and launch.



The C7 is Juechter's machine. Only the fifth chief engineer in the Corvette's history, he's likely to go down in the books as the one who got it right. For that he was **Automobile Magazine's 2014 Man of the Year**. He's been with GM since 1977 and has worked almost exclusively with Corvettes for the last twenty years, starting under then-chief Dave Hill. "It helps having worked on the C5 and C6," he jokes, "because you know where a lot of the land mines are."

Juechter is an eloquent engineer and he can be passionate about the Corvette in the way of a protective father. Tadge Juechter's masterpiece, the 2014 Chevrolet Corvette Stingray, was Automobile Magazine's 2014 Automobile of the Year.

“Route 66” Corvette Display in Lewisville

Thursday, January 24, the Red River Chapter of the Solid Axle Corvette Club displayed some of our cars at the MCL Grand Theater, Lewisville, TX. This special display in front of the theater honored the famous Corvettes, which were the real stars of the “Route 66” TV show. Charles Street, in front of the MCL Grand, was closed off to park our Vettes.

We visited and met some new C-1 owners, then dined across the street at Prohibition Chicken restaurant before the show. The weather was great for January. It was cold, but not windy, and not raining. That's the best we could hope for and were rewarded by having 11 Corvettes show up for display plus some members who came without their Vettes.

C-1 Corvettes present were: Charlie & Gloria Marks' Fawn Beige 61 and Tom & Marcia Martin's Fawn Beige 62 which were identical to those used in the TV show. Also Bill & Diane Preston's Black/White 57 Fuelie, Don Eckhart's Red/White 58 Fuelie, Bruce & Fay Jarrett's Blue/White 61,

Special thanks to Legends Corvette Club members for bringing their C-2's; Sam Deneault's Red 64 coupe and Bob & Linda Rockett's Blue 64 convertible. SACC members Dennis Conte, Tom & Mary Jean Entrekin and Lee & Jo Ann Brumit came to enjoy the evening without their cars. We also met several C-1 owners who we hope to see again.

The reason for this special program was that In January 1962 an episode of the legendary “Route 66” television program was taped in Lewisville. Renamed “Kilkenny, Texas” for the episode, the town served as the backdrop for stars Martin Milner, George Maharis, Tuesday Weld, Cloris Leachman, and Burt Reynolds.

At the program in the theater local historian Robin Cole-Jett spoke briefly about some of the historical landmarks featured in the episode and shared “then and now” photos. Then they showed a short video featuring stories from residents who remember the big event. The evening ended with a screening of the full episode of “Love Is a Skinny Kid.” The famous stars' looks changed a lot over the years and TV shows are more sophisticated now, but the Corvette looked the same as Tom Martin's '62 that was parked out front.

Somehow Tuesday Weld managed to ride in the 62 Corvette between the two stars in a couple of scenes. All of us kind of groaned when she did that. They cut

out the awkward part of her actually getting in. I guess that means the car they used was an automatic...

In the half century, since the television series "Route 66" went off the air, the road that the series took its title from, has been officially decommissioned. Many of the stars, guest stars, and even cameos from the series have gone on to successful film careers and/or passed away; and the American landscape--not to mention the Chevrolet Corvette that featured so prominently in the series--has dramatically changed.

Some fans of the show credit the show for popularizing the Corvette, even though the car was already on the market seven years when the show started. Each season the sponsor, Chevrolet, provided two Corvettes from that model year.

For trivia buffs, the production of the original show used Corvettes of varying colors, from Horizon Blue for

the first season to Fawn Beige for the second and third and Saddle Tan for the last two.

Many viewers thought the color of the Corvette was red, even though "Route 66" was shot in black-and-white. Maharis said in part of the first season, the Corvette was light blue. "But ... the cameraman said, It reflects too much light. He had trouble lighting us against the sky because the light blue was reflecting too much light. So, toward the end of the year, they gave us a brown one."

Maharis acquired a Corvette himself. Putting on his best poker face, he told "Route 66" sponsor Chevrolet that "we may have a little problem", because he had a Ford Thunderbird he would be driving to the set. Chevrolet quickly gave Maharis a Corvette. Of course, there was really no problem, because "I didn't have a car" at the time, Maharis said.

BUC-EE'S in Denton Now Has Ethanol-Free Gas!

Living in the DFW Metro and owning a Rochester Fuel-Injected Corvette or any carbureted car are not compatible. Until now our nearest Ethanol-Free Gas was over an hour away in Gainesville or Greenville. But the gas fairy has now come to our rescue... his name is BUC-EE!

The new store in Denton has been open a few weeks and has Ethanol-Free gas at every pump. And the bonus is that it's **92 octane!!!**

It is located at 2800 S. I-35E on the west side of I-35 between Hwy 288 and State School Road. Highway construction is underway in that area, so access is subject to change from day to day. Today, as I write, if you're northbound take Exit 463 (State School Rd) then double back at TX 288 onto the south bound frontage road. Southbound should exit 462. But you know that's probably going to change before you get there.

The other BUC-EE'S locations around the edges of Metro DFW do not have Ethanol-Free gas. The Texas locations that do have it are in Bastrop, Brazoria, Clute, Katy, Lake Jackson and Waller (all further south in Texas). I'm wondering how Denton is able



to have it, and I hope the "feds" don't close whatever loophole let it happen.

Luckily, those of you in Oklahoma don't have any problem getting Ethanol-Free gas pretty easily. At least now, we don't have to fill up all our gas cans at the border every time we come back into Texas.

I'll remind you to use my favorite phone application: **Pure-Gas.org**, to locate stations that sell Ethanol-Free gas anywhere in the US or Canada. As you're going down the road, it will give you the nearest station reported to sell it. You can also go on line to access a full list of stations.
